## SECRETARY'S REPORT

Dear Member,

I mentioned in the last Minutes that this year or next might be taken to mark the twenty-fifth anniversary of the formation of The Gambia Study Circle. Mr. Sheraton has kindly sent this information.

"At 8 p. m. on the evening of Thursday, 18th May, 1950 several Study Circles were held at Congress. There was one for those interested

in The Gambia and the leader was the late Mr. R. E. R. Dalwick. Mr. Sheraton and, I fancy, Mr. Whitfield was present with others". The meeting is referred to in the Congress handbook and in the foreword to Dalwick's "The Gambia".

We trust that this new Journal will help to mark the occasion of the anniversary and we also hope to arrange for it to be the subject of articles in the philatelic press. I would be pleased to know of anyone who would write on an aspect of West African philately.

The London Spring Meeting will be held on Saturday, 22nd March, 1975 at 2.30 p.m. at The Royal Commonwealth Society, Northumberland Avenue, London. Members who would like to join a luncheon party at The Sherlock Holmes beforehand are asked to let the President know so that a provisional booking can be made. It seems essential that we are all seated and placing orders by 12.30 p.m. if we are to finish the meal in good time for the meeting. The displays will be given in conjunction with The Forces Postal History Society and will cover all campaigns in West Africa. It should be possible to see material from all the colonies. Mr. Wright will be giving a special display on Cameroons. All members are asked to bring along Forces material, including the islands of St. Helena and Ascension.

I would like to draw members attention to three articles. The first appeared in Postal History International 'U.S. Foreign Mail Route No. 22' by A. Leslie Leon concerning the 1941 flights to West Africa. The second is in the London Philatelist 'De La Rue Specimen Stamps of the Crown Colonies' by Marcus Samuel. The first article is in the December 1974 issue, the second in the January 1975 issue. The January issue of The Philatelist is due to contain an article by myself on Sierra Leone Bisects.

Finally, we congratulate these members on successes at the B. P. E. Exhibition. Mr. Bavington-Jones, Silver for The Gambia; Mr. C. McCaig, Silver for the Nigerias; Mr. C. McCaig, Bronze-Silver for Nigeria; Mr. P. Humphreys, Bronze for Nigeria. I trust that no one has been omitted from this and other similar lists that have been published. The exhibits give us good publicity.

**NORTHERN MEETING OCTOBER 1974**

The first Northern autumn meeting of the Circle was held in the Masonic Temple, Bridge Street, Manchester on Saturday, 19th October 1974. Present: The President, J.J. Martin, and Messrs. D. Bockock, F. Dobson, C. Disbrey, L. Glover, C. Graham, E. Lewis, C. McCaig and J. Whitfield.

Mr. McCaig opened the meeting showing 45 sheets of the Gambia 1922/27 issue as displayed at the Gibbons Gallery last February. These included progress Die Proofs for the 'pence' values; Die Proof for the 'shilling' values; illustrations of the different 'pence' perforations; with a selection of shades and multiples. He also showed a coloured photograph of the original sketches in the De La Rue Records at the National Postal Museum, where they are described as "water colour sketches of the 3d. in final colours and the 1/- in bright vermilion and black" dated 13th Dec. 21 and marked 'Approved Herbert F. Smith 13/12/21.' The designs had been approved by H.M. the King on 29/11/21 "for reproduction by the copper plate process".

The President continued the meeting with a display of various West African covers including Registered p. s. envelopes cancelled with the first type of Registered/Niger Travelling Post Office ovals dated 31 JA 6 and JY 6 06. He also showed a cover to Sheffield marked "S. S. Nubia" bearing a British 1887 issue 6d. stamp cancelled at Liverpool, 29th November, 1891.

Mr. McCaig passed round the September, 1974 number of the Postal History Journal which contained the first section (Gambia and Sierra Leone) of an illustrated article he had contributed on the Development of British West Africa: Its Postal History and Postmarks. Mr. Glover had loaned the earliest recorded letter from the Gambia and two early covers for illustration.

#### FERNANDO PO

Since I wrote my paper on the West African Postal Agencies I have been able to see the 247 cancellation used on cover at Elmham, Norfolk. This was struck in blue-black. The Elmham backstamp is undated but Thetford and Dereham are struck on MR 13 1839. The type of cancellation is very similar to that used later in Fernando Po though the style of lettering differs slightly. The distinguishing feature is as previously stated. Elmham has no dot following the 247: Fernando Po has.

It still remains the case that as far as the writer knows, no cover from Fernando Po has been seen bearing 247. However, its usage there is proved from Post Office lists and from single stamps bearing the cancellation.

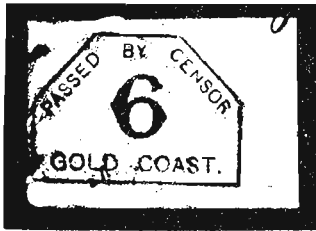
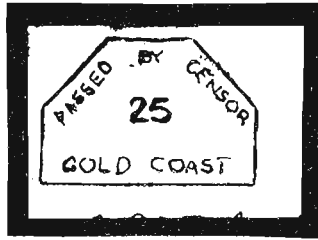
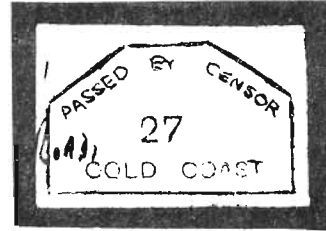
##### The Hexagonal Censor Marks of The Second World War

A six-sided censor handstamp enclosing "PASSED BY CENSOR / (number) GOLD COAST" was applied to civilian mail from the Gold Coast. A study of the censor numbers and postmarks suggests that there is no correlation. It is probable that the censor(s) operated in certain centres such as Accra and Takoradi and that all mail from the various towns and villages in the Gold Coast was censored at these centres.

The handstamps are all the same size, 40 mm. base and 27.5 mm high (type 1) except for '27' which has a 45 mm. base (type 3) but the same height, 27.5 mm. Also, '25' (type 2) and '27' both have a much smaller number than the others. Various colours exist, usually red, violet or blue. In some cases it is extremely difficult to describe the colour exactly.

Mention should also be made of the re-sealing strips, in various colours, bearing "GOLD COAST/OPENED BY CENSOR". It is hoped to deal with these in a later article.

I have seen two covers sent to the U. K. by Officers with this handstamp. In both cases, the Officer was his own censor.

TOGO

The Editor has an unused copy of SG. 28, the narrow setting 1<sup>d</sup> on 5 pfg green, with the whole overprint very much thicker than is normal. Has anyone else come across a similar heavy overprint? It might, of course, be a forgery but this particular stamp would not really be worth forging. It could also be a case of over-inking.
