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#### **Preface to Fourth Edition**

The project to record all possible examples of this elusive issue continues relentlessly. A further nine examples have been identified since the third edition was published four years ago, giving a new total of 169 stamps out of the maximum of 240. As well as these new discoveries, several units have come to the market for the first time in decades. This has provided the opportunity to upgrade the quality of images, often replacing decades old black and white images.

#### **Newly Identified Stamps**

The following nine stamps have been added in this edition: IIT 07, IIT 08, IIT 26, IIB 21, IIB 30, IIIT 04, IVT 04, IVT 27 and IVB 17. The first eight of these are all mint, with the last being the 18th postally used example recorded.

#### **Preface to Third Edition**

Two years on, and even more examples have come to light. Since the second edition, 13 units have been newly recorded. Of very significant importance are the final two examples of Type C. Previously 14 of the 16 possible examples had been recorded - and these were all mint. The 15th example had been circulating in American auction houses below my radar - this was also a mint example. But then the 16th and final stamp appeared in an Italian auction - and it was used! This used stamp will surely be recognised in the catalogues in due course and it can categorically be stated as being a unique stamp.

There are now 160 different stamps illustrated in this edition. As well as the new discoveries, many additional references to the provenance of items have been added or the image quality improved.

Three significant items have come to light in that they are both forged. It had always surprised me that no fabricated examples had previously been encountered bearing in mind the very high catalogue values. One of the items is a mint stamp that has had a Freetown cancellation added, and the others are cleaned revenue stamps with the overprint added. Each of these cleaned revenue stamps has received a 'bad' certificates from the Royal.

A catalyst for the creation of this edition has been the tenacity of Majed Halawi who has traced several of the newly discovered items now listed. He has been very willing to share his discoveries and I would like to express my gratitude for his support.

Newly Identified Stamps: The following stamps have been added to this edition: IT 03, IT 17, IB 01, IIT 06, IIB 29, IIIT 05, IIIT 09, IVT 04, IVT 06, IVB 01, IVB 14, IVB 15 and IVB 16.

The stamp identified as Sheet II Top Position 6 is actually from Sheet I Bottom Position 20.

# Chapter 1

# Introduction

The 1897 Sierra Leone stamps with the 2½d overprint on the 2s revenue designs are amongst the great rarities of British Commonwealth stamps. There were only four sheets of 60 overprinted, giving a total of 240 stamps but, given the variety of font used for the overprint, there are six catalogued stamps. Three of these appeared only once per pane of 30, hence only eight of each ever existed.

Because of the very low production figures, these stamps are considerably sought-after and realise high prices at auction. The Stanley Gibbons catalogue (cover date 2021) values a mint set of six at £191,000. Several of the rarest stamps are beyond collectors' reach in The British Library Philatelic Collection (Ref. 1.1) or The Royal Philatelic Collection (Ref. 1.2).

In 2008 I started considering the percentages of these stamps that were ever used for postal purposes, and also what the survival rate has been over time. One further question was which of the six overprinted stamps existed in used condition; at the time, SG listed all of the types other than Type C - but I had never seen some of them.

Initially I looked at all of the reference material I had in my own files, but rapidly realised that I would need to cast my net more widely. Perhaps the most helpful source was the extensive collection of auction catalogues held by the Royal Philatelic Society London (RPSL). One or two of the major London auction houses have now put their archived catalogues on to the internet. As these are readily searchable, new items were quickly identified.

The two major expert committees in the UK, the British Philatelic Association (BPA) and the RPSL were approached. They both allowed access to their photographic archives. The RPSL Expert Committee has examples of identifiable stamps going back to 1915. Another significant holding of these rarities is the Colonial Stamp Company Reference Collection, and scans were made available for research. All of these sources were meticulously recorded, which ultimately led to the four sheets being partially reconstructed.

Out of the total of 240 stamps, 169 different ones have been positively identified. A summary of the individual stamps recorded, broken down by type shows:

It was as a result of this research that Stanley Gibbons removed Type F in used condition from their 2010 catalogue after seeing the evidence that eight mint copies still exist.

The survival of 60 out of 64 examples of the rarer types is a remarkably high rate. The existence of these stamps was first reported in *The London Philatelist* in April 1897 for the 3d and 6d values (Ref. 1.3), May 1897 for the 1s (Ref. 1.4) and July 1897 for the 2s (Ref. 1.5), which confirms that collectors were aware of the issue and its varieties very soon after it came out. Given the extensive interest in such locally produced overprints of all colonies in the 1890s, it is not surprising that much of the issue - and especially the rarer types - were obtained by philatelists at the time.

To help readers identify any individual stamp and learn of its provenance, all types other than Type A are illustrated in Chapter 4 on pages with others of the same type. Only a brief summary of the provenance of each stamp is given here; readers should look for the full details which are given for each sheet in Chapter 5.

#### **Quality of Reproductions**

One of the most challenging aspects of the production of this book is the consistency of the quality and colour of the images. Altogether 169 different stamps are reproduced; it is likely that over 100 different cameras / scanners were used! Hence the resultant reproductions in this book vary considerably. The oldest image is from a photograph taken by the Royal Philatelic Society London Expert Committee in 1915. This stamp, Position 25 from the lower half of Sheet II, has not been recorded since that date.

The actual stamps from all four sheets are very similar in appearance with respect to colour; any difference of appearance in this book is down to the reproduction of the image in auction catalogues etc. No attempt has been made to digitally correct the shade variation.

#### **Prices Quoted**

The price information has been taken from very many different sources. Most realisations will be hammer price, but undoubtedly some will include commission. For the values in the columns headed 'estimates', these are the figures quoted in the printed catalogues. Where a range is given, the mid-point has been taken. Several auction houses quote catalogue price rather than an actual estimate; others are reserves rather than estimates. Readers of this book are strongly advised to take the values as guidance only.

#### **Forgeries**

Bearing in mind the high catalogue values of some of these stamps, it is remarkable that so few forgeries have been encountered either during the research of the book. One reason for this is that the host 2s STAMP DUTY adhesive is itself very difficult to obtain in mint condition. The forged examples discovered so far are included in Chapter 7.

#### **Background Reading**

# Chapter 2

# **Stamp Duty Revenue Issue**

In 1884 Sierra Leone had difficulty in deciding which stamps were to be used for collecting revenue. Within a few months at the end of the year, three different series of stamps were delivered to Freetown.

Following the Stamp Duty Ordinance of 1884 (Ref. 2.1), the Colonial Secretary ordered both a set of adhesive stamps and also a set of embossed dies which could be impressed directly upon a document. They became worried about the production time and also ordered a special printing, in different colours, of the then current 1d, 3d, 6s and 1s adhesives overprinted with the word REVENUE.

The embossed dies and the REVENUE overprinted adhesives were both produced and sent to the colony; the fate of these two series is beyond the scope of this publication. For details, readers should consult Beale (Ref. 2.2).

It is the tall stamps inscribed SIERRA LEONE STAMP DUTY that are of interest as they form the basic stamps which were subsequently overprinted for postal use.

The stamps were on CA over Crown watermarked paper and perforated 14.

#### GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given, that on and after the 1st day of March next, the use of Postage Stamps for other than Postal purposes is to be discontinued.

A supply of adhesive Revenue Stamps has been

obtained and these stamps are to be employed for all purposes of the Stamp Duty Ordinance, No. 1 of 1884.

Stamps of the value of 1d., 3d., 6d., 1s., 2s., 5s. and £1 are procurable at the Colonial Treasury, and facilities will also be size to the Freetown, and facilities will also be given to the general public for procuring Stamps of the lower denominations as at present exist in regard to Postage Stamps.

The stamps were printed and despatched to Freetown quickly as a notice in the Sierra Leone Royal Gazette tells us that they were put on sale on 1 March 1885.

These issues were used on a wide range of revenue documents, being cancelled either by a manuscript signature or by an official handstamp.

Despite the relatively high numbers printed, collectors do not frequently encounter the STAMP DUTY adhesives, either mint or fiscally used, especially the higher values.

# Chapter 3

# Postage and Revenue Overprints

#### The Need for Overprinted Stamps

Sierra Leone had been using stamps from the first De La Rue keyplate since 1872. By 1892 the plate had become worn, and it was decided to adopt the De La Rue Postage & Revenue keyplate for a full range of values. The process of deciding what values and colours were to be issued took several years to conclude, with the first despatches of the new stamps not being made until 3 September 1896.

The following despatches were made of 2½d stamps:

Between 1 January 1891 (Ref. 3.1) and 24 December 1897 (Ref. 3.2) the half-ounce letter rate to the United Kingdom was  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d, thus making this value the second most used postage stamp at the time. The main usage was the 1d which paid the internal rate,

A letter from the Crown Agents to De La Rue dated 9 April 1896 urged them to progress the order for the new designs 'as soon as possible' (Ref. 3.3). Considering this urgency alongside the despatch figures quoted above suggest clearly that the stock of  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d stamps in Freetown was running low towards the end of 1896.

Another possibility for the overprint is that the authorities had a surplus stock of some values of the tall revenue stamps and they wished to use them.

#### **Printer**

Unfortunately there are no primary sources existing that show who printed the overprint. Philip Beale (Ref. 3.4) and Bertram Poole (Ref. 3.5) make no comment as to who did the overprints; Robson Lowe (Ref. 3.6) states 'overprinted locally', but does not give any source to support his assertion.

There can however be little doubt that the overprinting was undertaken in Freetown. The font is very similar to that used for the 1893 HALF PENNY and the Commission of Enquiry that followed the clandestine printings of that issue helpfully identifies the work as having been done by the 'Government Printer' (Refs 3.7 and 3.8).

Further, the fact that so many different fonts for the '2' and '½' characters were used suggests that the printer involved did not have an extensive supply of type; this would not have been the case for a printer such as De La Rue.

One final indicator is the relatively poor quality of the work. The overprint forme is often applied at an angle or misplaced.

#### **Date of Issue**

The Stanley Gibbons catalogue (Ref. 3.9) gives a date of issue for the 2½d overprints on the 3d and 6d values as 27 February 1897, and on the 1s and 2s values as 1 March 1897. No primary source has been seen that provides any indication of exactly when the stamps were put on sale.

The fact that the overprint forme used on the 3d and 6d values is different from the one used on the 1s and 2s values indicates that they were printed at different times; what is not clear is which way round they were printed. Poole (Ref. 3.10) states that the shilling values were overprinted after the pence ones, and *Africa Part III* (Ref. 3.11) says that the shilling values had 'a new setting', implying a subsequent printing. No source is given to support either statement.

It is highly likely that the authorities in Freetown were conscious of the accounting implications of the overprinting, in that they were effectively reducing the book value of any stock by overprinting it. It is therefore probable that they would take the lower values first, leaving the 1s and 2s values until last.

The earliest dated postmarks seen are:

2½d on 3d	27 Feb 1897
2½d on 6d	27 Feb 1897
2½d on 1s	27 Mar 1897
21/2d on 2s	20 Apr 1897

There are 18 recorded copies of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d on 2s that have a cancellation, of which 16 have readable postmarks. The dates recorded are: 20 Apr 1897 (x2), 28 Apr 1897, 1 May 1897, 4 May 1897 (x2), 14 Aug 1897 (x4), 28 Apr 1898, 28 May 1898 (x4) and 9 Nov 1898.

#### **Number of Stamps Overprinted**

There are no primary records existing that show the quantity of stamps overprinted. The best source is a secondary reference that appeared in *The London Philatelist* in November 1897 (Ref. 3.12). This is a letter to the editor from W.L. Chew, who wrote:

I enclose the copy of a letter I have received from the acting Col. Postmaster-General of Sierra Leone, with reference to the Provisional Stamps which were issued by that Colony last spring, which may possibly be of interest to your readers.

GENERAL POST OFFICE FREETOWN, SIERRA LEONE 25th October, 1897.

Sir.

*In compliance with the request contained in your note of the 8th inst., I furnish hereunder the information asked for in regard to the issue of stamps of this Colony, surcharged 'POSTAGE AND REVENUE' in sheets of 120 stamps.* 

I have the honour to be, Sir,

Your obedient servant,

(Signature illegible),

Acting Col, Postmaster General.

From evidence to hand it is certain that the sheets were in panes of 60 rather than of 120. We also know that there were at least eight examples of the rarest  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d on 2s stamps, hence it can be deduced with confidence that the numbers of stamps is correctly reported by the official from the Sierra Leone GPO, but that the number of stamps in a sheet was erroneously quoted. Given the above, there can be no doubt that just 240 stamps with the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d overprint on the 2s value were produced.

#### **Overprint Types**

The printer did not have sufficient type to make an overprint forme of 30 identical styles. As well as the marked differences in the font of the characters '2½d', there are also differences to the full stop and the cancelling bars.

#### **Overprint Arrangement**

The overprint forme was applied twice to each sheet of 60 stamps, once on the top half and once on the bottom half. There were two settings: one applied to the 3d and 6d Stamp Duty adhesives, and a different layout applied to the 1s and 2s value. There are several fundamental differences of the basic layout of the type on each stamp between the two formes. On the pence values, the wording is in three lines POSTAGE / AND / REVENUE above the '2½'d' and there are six thin lines cancelling the previous value. For the shilling values, the wording is in just two lines POSTAGE AND / REVENUE which are below the '2½'d'; there are just five thin lines covering the value tablet.

The layout of the two formes has been confirmed by the existence of full sheets of all values other than 2½d on 2s which has been verified by either strips and pairs or by the reconstruction work done for this book.

#### **Constant Features of Individual Positions**

The main focus of this book is the four sheets of 2s Stamp Duty adhesives that were overprinted '2½d'. Whilst reconstructing the eight formes, certain constant characteristics were identified that helped identify individual positions.

The position numbers referenced go from 1 to 30. This is a simple counting of the stamps from left to right and top to bottom as follows:





#### **Type Naming Conventions**

Over the years the naming conventions for the various fonts of overprint has varied considerably; this has inevitably caused confusion to collectors. The situation was at its most confusing in the period 1919 to 1990 when both Stanley Gibbons and Scott used the lower-case letters a to f - but in a different order!

This booklet uses the Types as defined by Philip Beale, and used by the West Africa Study Circle. These are independent from the main catalogue publishers, and have remained constant over the years.

Although Type E does not exist on the 2s value, it has been included in this comparison for completion.

#### **Spacing of Overprint Forme**

With only four sheets being overprinted, it was a surprise to discover that the vertical spacing of the rows of the overprint forme is not consistent. Sheets I, II and IV are identical, but the distance between the three sets of bars on Sheet III is shorter.



The top of the lowest set of bars have been aligned, clearly showing how the rows of the overprint forme are set much more closely on Sheet III.

Several large blocks of the overprint on the 1s values have been examined, and all of these match the spacing on Sheets I, II and IV of the 2s. On the exceptional 2s Sheet III, the spacing on the top and bottom halves of the sheet is the same.

This variation suggests that the forme is made up of three elements each ten stamps wide and the height of one row. It would appear that these were clamped together, but the forme became loose and needed repositioning during the print run.

# **Chapter 4**

# **Rare Types**

### Type B Position 19 (SG 68, Type 9; Scott 63, Type e)

Type B occurs only once in the overprint forme, in position 19. The large '2' has a ball at the top and a straight base. These features are similar to Type C, but Type B is narrower. Of the eight examples that were printed, six remain mint and one used; the eighth copy has yet to be recorded.















# Chapter 5

# **Reconstructions and Provenances**

#### **Reconstruction Techniques**

Reconstructing the eight panes from illustrations can be equated to trying to complete a jigsaw puzzle with a third of the pieces missing, and also without a picture!

After an initial period of trial and error, a systematic approach was adopted. The first thing necessary was to obtain a uniform-sized illustration. This itself is not a straightforward exercise as, before the introduction of scanning in the 1990s, all images came from photographs. This often created images that were not absolutely rectangular as frequently the camera would not be directly above the stamp, yielding a trapezoid image. Further, images were sometimes distorted in the ratio of height to width. With modern software all of these challenges were overcome and a uniform, double linear sized paper copy was produced.

The easy stamps were positioned first: the obvious ones here were the unique Types B and F, the italic N and the Broken Large 2 varieties (Positions 19, 12, 24 and 9 respectively). Next were the two Type C stamps from positions 15 and 16 in the middle of the pane. It was soon realised that the two stamps were easily distinguished by the size of the full-stop. After these came the other Type D stamps from positions 18, 22 and 23. A few marginal examples and strips or pairs were also most useful.

But at this point it was still not easy to see the solution: for example, initially there were seven examples of Type C position 15 and seven of Type C position 16: but which ones went together as pairs?

There were numerous little clues that allowed this task to be progressed. Primarily the positioning of the five black bars at the bottom of the stamp was used, but this is rarely conclusive in its own right as many appear similar. Also to be taken into consideration were the centring of the overprint on the stamp, the centring of the stamps within the perforations and pulled perfs. When a pair of long and short perfs are re-joined a conclusive match is apparent.

The positioning of the Type A stamps took a very considerable amount of time. The distinctive stamps were positioned first on large blank matrices, and then the more common stamps fitted around them. Slowly but surely groups of a small number of matched stamps were joined together into the reconstructed sheets that appear on the following pages. Regularly groups of stamps were moved between the panes as the evidence grew.

The naming of the sheets I, II, III and IV is completely arbitrary.

#### **Provenances**

Throughout this research, meticulous notes have been kept of the source of each illustration. Over 400 different images have been recorded, relating to 169 different stamps. Perhaps surprisingly, more than 40 of the stamps have only been seen from one source, often in major collections such as the Royal Philatelic Collection or the British Library. The Type F stamp from the bottom of Pane I has been recorded from different sources a total of ten times, the highest count.

The following 32 pages provide a pane-by-pane breakdown of the provenances of each of the stamps, followed by an illustration of the reconstructed pane.

# **Chapter 6**

# **Early Records**

These elusive stamps started appearing in public auctions very soon after their issue date. The earliest reference discovered is to a Plumridge sale in London on 5 March 1901, less than four years after the issue date.

Another very early reference can be found in *The London Philatelist* of December 1902 (Ref. 6.1). This is a report of an 'Exhibition of the South African Colonies'. The Sierra Leone section was as follows:

### SIERRA LEONE

These stamps were shown by Baron A. de Worms, Messrs. C. McNaughtan and H.J. White. In the first case the general issues were shown practically complete, and included the Halfpenny CA of 1894 with inverted surcharge. Mr. White's stamps included a sheet of twenty-five of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d on 2s, containing all types, inclusive of the rare thick 'd'. Mr. McNaughtan's exhibit was very strong in the provisional issues.

It is not clear exactly what the phrase 'a sheet of twenty-five' meant as the sheets were of 60 stamps and the forme was of 30. Nevertheless, it is a block that would have made a wonderful reference piece today.

On 22 November 1906 Ventom, Bull and Cooper sold a lot described as: "Sierra Leone, 2½d on 2s dull lilac, horizontal pair, Types a and d used together with four other 2½d provisionals on piece of registered envelope". This is the only reference to a cover. The lot was sold for £7 2s 6d. The used pair (Sheet IV Bottom, stamps 14 and 15) has now been recorded. This item has set, as far as is known, a new record price for a Sierra Leone item when it realised €75,000 at auction in Italy in April 2017.

Puttick and Simpson offered on 23 April 1912: "Sierra Leone, 2½ d on 2s lilac, a strip of 10, being the bottom row of sheet, with margins, consisting of seven Type a and three Type d." This lot realised £16 15s. Whilst this piece does not exist today it is interesting to note that it had sheet margins; very few marginal examples remain.

The early auction catalogues are seldom illustrated, with the first photographs of 2½d on 2s being those in the Ferrari sale in 1923. After 1932 photographs of these rare items appeared regularly. The earliest photograph encountered anywhere is from an RPSL Certificate dated 1915.

There are several auction descriptions which cannot be correct. In 1915 the 'War Fund' sale offered a Type f used; Plumridge offered a strip of three, Types a, a and c as well as a pair of Types a and e in their 26 June 1919 auction.

# Chapter 7

# **Forgeries**

Bearing in mind the high catalogue values of some of these stamps, it is remarkable that so few forgeries have been encountered during the research of the book. One reason for this is that the host 2s STAMP DUTY adhesive is itself very difficult to obtain in mint condition. Only three forged examples have been discovered so far.







Two forgeries apparently from the same source. Both are chemically cleaned used revenue stamps with forged overprint and 'postmark'. Additionally there are traces of the POSTAGE / AND / REVENUE three line overprint similar to that applied on the contemporary ONE PENNY Stamp Duty adhesive.

Genuine unused example from Position 29 of Sheet II Bottom with a facsimile cancellation to appear as a used stamp.
